Reminded as we are by the words of Our Holy Father and the pastoral guidance of our Bishop Patrick Dunn:

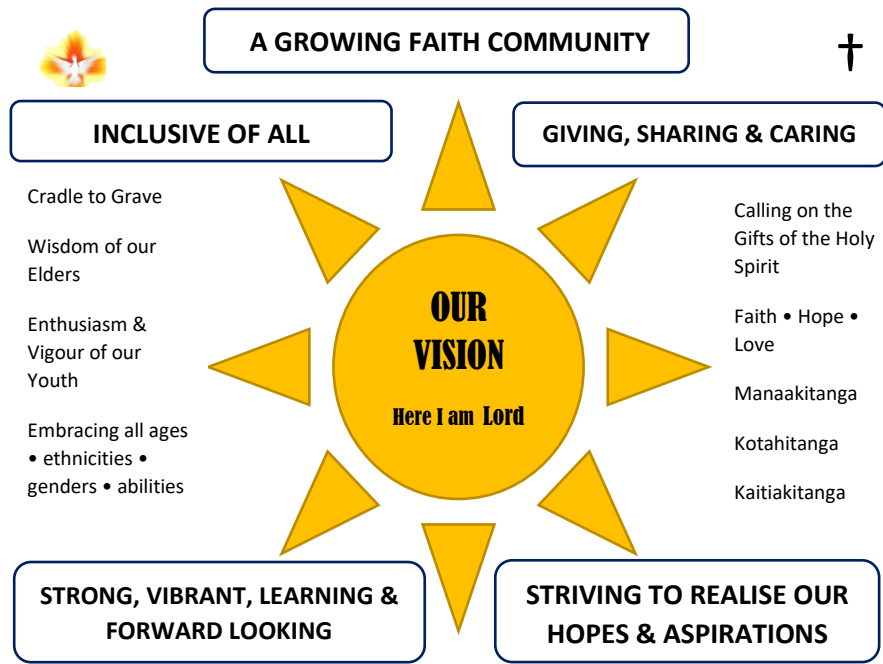

- How to grow our parishes and connect with the wider community
- Caring for our brothers and sisters of all ages and particularly Nga Rangatira, according to their needs
- Visiting the sick and celebrating our faith
