National Assembly of Diocesan Priests



Approximately 175 Priests, from each of the six dioceses of New Zealand, attended the National Assembly of Diocesan Priests held in Novotel Hotel in Rotorua from 9th to 13th of October. The last assembly was held in Christchurch in 2018.

The attendees heard presentations from various speakers on pressing subjects. One of the presentations was delivered by the Archbishop of

Brisbane, Mark Coleridge, who expounded about the Spirituality of the Diocesan Priest in the 21st Century. Archbishop Mark said, "The diocesan priesthood today has to come from an in-between personality. We have to live between being pilgrim and settler." Likewise, Father Vui Huong, assistant parish priest of New Plymouth; Father Craig Butler, Parish Priest of Whanganui; and Mena Antonio, chief executive of Caritas Aotearoa NZ, shared their presentations during the first day of the assembly. The first day of the assembly ended with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist at Saint Michael's Church in Rotorua.

Wednesday presentations revolved around the topic of Evangelisation, Outreach, and Mission. Archbishop Mark remarked that "Imagination is part of evangelisation – doing stuff we've never done before." Fr Sherwin Lapaan, Parish Priest of Saint Mark's in Pakuranga, described transforming Saint Mark's as a missionary parish. The new Bishop of Palmerston North, John Adams spoke of the winning vision implemented in his former parish of Saint Peter Chanel in North Canterbury. And the Catholic Enquiry Centre Director, Rebecca Taylor-Hunt set out the changes she's been making. The second day session culminated with a Miha Māori in Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

The third day of presentations involved sharing from Hannah and James van Schie on their faith practice and life as a Catholic couple. Hannah, James and their three children put a plastic bag of little toys in every table and asked all the priests to take them out and play with them during this session. Hannah said that, "All parents know that a toy is helpful for keeping children in the pews at Mass rather than running outside to climb the trees. We're employing the same principle here today to keep you in this room." The other presenters were Dr Therese Lautua and Lucienne Hensel, who shared on their experiences participating in the synod process. The third and final day of presentations culminated with a Mass in Saint Michael's and a final dinner in the evening.

Each day there was also the opportunity to do different activities around Rotorua. The National Assembly of Diocesan Priests was successful and reinvigorating. Thank you to the members of the organising committee for a successful event. - Fr. Mark Napa (Takapuna Parish)

Pope Francis has appointed Father Richard Laurenson from the Diocese of Hamilton as the new Catholic Bishop of Hamilton. The appointment was announced in Rome, Wednesday 25 October. Bishop-elect Laurenson, the parish priest at All Saints by the Sea, Papamoa Coast, replaces Bishop Stephen Lowe, who left when he was appointed Bishop of Auckland in December 2021. It means all six New Zealand dioceses now have a bishop, following the recent ordination and installation of Bishop John Adams as Bishop of Palmerston North.
